FIRST TEAM - FALL SEASON PREVIEW

Quite a bit has happened since the close of the 2009 -2010 Metropolitan League season. For starters, AAC Eagles finished atop the leader board, edging out Schwaben AC by one point to claim the championship. At the other end of the table, SC Lituanica finished dead last and was subjected to automatic relegation. Coming up to replace them in the Major Division was First Division Champions, International. The remaining spot in the Major Division for the 2010-2011 season was determined in a play-off between second from last in the Major Division (Vikings) and the runners-up from the First Division (Connection), which was won by Connection SC in a 5-1 drubbing. But just as the divisions were being realigned, word came that Maroons, who finished last season tied on points in the middle of the pack with Green White, had decided to sit this season out; somehow doing so in a manner that reserved their place in the league for the season after next. (Note: Next year's league meeting should be interesting when Maroon make their return. Will they come back in the First Division or claim a right to a spot in the Majors? If it's the later, who gets demoted? To be certain, these are the questions that will be asked.) In any event, Maroons' exit meant that Vikings was suddenly back in the Major Division. For Green White faithful, the scenario must have seemed like déjà vu all over again. The only exception being that in both the 2007-2008 and 2008-209 seasons, GW was the relegated/reinstated team; first in '08 when Wings elected to stay in the First Division despite winning promotion and then in '09 when Polonia folded after GW lost the end of season playoff game to SC Lituanica. And so goes the saying, sometimes it is better to be lucky than good.

The First Team was scheduled to kick off the 2010-2011 season on August 29th, but the game was post-poned at the request of HNK Zrinski. Still the rest of the league started the season and in other Metropolitan League, Major Division action on August 29th: United Serbs 1 - Eagles 0; International 1 - Vikings 0; Schwaben 5 - Connection 1; Sockers - Belgrade (rescheduled).


GREEN WHITE SC "PLAYER" PROFILE: STEVE PASTORELLI

HOW I CAME TO GREEN WHITE: I IMMIGRATED TO THE UNITED STATES IN THE SPRING OF 1961, JOINING THE REST OF MY FAMILY IN CHICAGO. BE-ING OF ITALIAN DECENT, I OF COURSE, HOOKED UP WITH THE MAROONS AND PLAYED FOR THEM AS AN ATTACKING WINGER IN 1963-64. I THEN STARTED A 45 YEAR CAREER WITH DELUXE AS A PRINTER. WORKING NIGHTS CURTAILED MY SOCCER PLAYING CAREER, BUT I NEVER LOST THE PASSION FOR THE GAME. I WAS DRAFTED INTO THE ARMY IN 1966 AND SERVED A YEAR LONG TOUR OF DUTY IN VIETNAM AS A MEMBER OF THE RECON PLATOON OF THE 4TH INFANTRY DIVISION. THERE WAS NO TIME FOR SOCCER BACK THEN AS WE SPENT MONTHS AT A TIME ON ADVANCED PA-TROLS IN SEARCH OF ENEMY POSITIONS. IT WAS A TOUGH TIME, DURING WHICH I ACHIEVED THE RANK OF SERGEANT: RECEIVED A PRESIDENTIAL CITATION; THE VIETNAM MERITORIOUS SERVICE METAL AND A PURPLE HEART. (DON'T ASK). UPON MY RETURN TO THE STATES, I GOT MARRIED AND SETTLED DOWN TO START A FAMILY. UP TO THAT POINT, I'D NEVER HEARD OF GREEN WHITE. MY FIRST INTRODUCTION TO THE CLUB CAME WHEN MY OLDEST SON, MICHAEL, PLAYED IN 1983-84 AND WAS COACHED BY WALTER MELCHER AT THE U14 LEVEL. MICHAEL MOVED ON TO PLAY HIGH SCHOOL SOCCER AFTER JUST ONE YEAR WITH THE CLUB, BUT I LIKED WHAT I SAW, WHEN MY YOUNGER SON, ANTHONY, BECAME INTERESTED IN SOCCER, AND REFUSED TO PLAY FOR THE MAROONS, WE CAME STRAIGHT BACK TO GW. I COACHED ANTHONY AND THOSE GW TEAMS FROM 1986 TO 1996 (U10 – U18). ONE OF THE HIGHLIGHTS, WITHOUT A DOUBT, WAS THE TEAM'S 1989 TOUR OF GERMANY THROUGH TOWNS LIKE HANNOVER AND SCHAUMBURG. OUR U13 KIDS HELD THEIR OWN AGAINST THEIR GER-MAN COUNTERPARTS, GOING 2-1-1 ON THE CAMPAIGN. WE SEEMED TO DO BETTER IN THE SECOND HALVES. PERHAPS IT WAS BECAUSE THE GERMAN YOUNGSTERS REPLENISHED WITH SWIGS OF BEER AT HALF TIME. IT MAY HAVE BEEN NORMAL FOR THEM, BUT WAS NOT EXACTLY AN ACCEPTED PRACTICE IN OUR PROGRAM. ANOTHER HIGHLIGHT WAS WHEN OUR KIDS PRACTICED WITH MEMBERS OF THE MEN'S U.S. NATIONAL TEAM IN THE BUILDUP TO THE 1994 WORLD CUP. AFTER MY KIDS STOPPED PLAYING SOC-CER, MY INVOLVEMENT WITH THE CLUB CONTINUED. I HAVE BEEN A MEM-BER OF THE YOUTH BOARD FOR 16 YEARS AND HAVE SERVED AS THE CLUB'S EQUIPMENT MANAGER FOR JUST ABOUT AS LONG. I WAS ALSO A LONG TIME MEMBER OF THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE AND ASSISTANT CLUB-HOUSE MANAGER. LAST YEAR, I ACCEPTED THE POSITION OF CLUBHOUSE MANAGER. BESIDES MY CHRISTMAS MASTACCOLLI, PERHAPS MY GREATEST CONTRIBUTION TO THE CLUB WAS MY DECISION AS EQUIPMENT MANAGER TO CHANGE THE TEAM KITS FROM THE TRADITIONAL "KELLY GREEN" AND WHITE TO THE CURRENT "FOREST GREEN" AND WHITE. AT THE TIME, THE DECISION RAISED A FEW EYEBROWS WITH THE ELDERS, BUT EVERYONE THANKS ME NOW. IF NOTHING ELSE, I AM A FASHION ICON. 27 YEARS LATER, I'M STILL WITH THE CLUB. NOT BAD FOR A GUY WHO NEVER PLAYED.

Still, GW started the match well and held a lot of the possession with some nice passing combinations and movement. 


GREEN WHITE GATERS (BU10) SNAP UP 2ND PLACE AT BUFFALO GROVE TOURNAMENT.
